## Christmas Performance Important Information.

We are going to plan for TWO performances per class this year only. **Seating will be STRICTLY restricted to 3 people per child.**

**Please note that we ask that babies and small children only attend the performances in RED below to avoid disruption and distraction for the children performing.**

Dates and times are:

- Monday 11th December 9.15am – Years 1 & 2
- Monday 11th December 1.45pm – Years 3&4
- Tuesday 12th December 9.30am – Nursery & Reception
- Tuesday 12th December 1.45pm – Years 1&2
- Wednesday 13th December 9.15am – Years 3&4
- Friday 15th December 9.30am – Nursery & Reception

There will be a £1 entry charge per person (payable on the door at each performance) to help towards the costs of creating Christmas productions and performance licenses.

We have received a number of requests for class lists for Christmas cards, party invitations etc; however, we are unable to provide named lists – apologies.

There are 21 children in Nursery, 30 in Reception, 32 in Y1, 26 in Y2, 23 in Y3 and 30 in Y4 at present – hopefully this will help a little.

## GOVERNOR NEWS

Governor activity this term (so far):

**Carol Redhead** – SEND visit to look at the school's audit of its provision for pupils with Special Needs and to see interventions and support in action. **Dave Anderson** – accompanied Mrs Endacott on her termly maths observations and discussed the monitoring and evaluation of this subject.

**Resource Management Committee** met and discussed the following policies: Finance, Best Value Statement & Statement of Internal Control, Whistle Blowing, Looked After Children and First Aid. They also discussed the new emergency internal alert system, the premises, finance and the visiting governor's report on safeguarding.

**Strategic Policy and Direction Committee** met and discussed the following policies: PSHE, Assessment, Emotion Self-Regulation and Behaviour, Child Protection and Safeguarding, Special Educational Needs, Tackling Extremism and Radicalisation, Complaints Against the Curriculum, Educational Visits Off-Site, Online Safety, Fluency in Maths and Computing. They also discussed the visiting governors' reports on Science and safeguarding.
