GOVERNOR NEWS - MEET THE CHAIR OF GOVERNORS - Angela Hall

Why did you choose to be a governor at Holywell Village First School?

I live in the village and have over 10 years' experience as a governor in other schools which I wanted to bring to our village school. I also work across Seaton Valley Federation of Schools (our feeder schools for the children of Holywell Village First School) and have a role which involves working within the local community to support the children in those schools with opportunities both within and outside of the curriculum.

Together with the above and my strategic experience from working in schools and industry for a number of years means that I am able to work with and support our Head Teacher in doing our very best for our children.

What motivation / experience do you have as Chair that will benefit our school?

I have been a governor at our school for nearly two years now and have been Chair of the Resource Management Committee for over 18 months. I also have been Chair of a number of committees in previous governor roles at other schools.

During my many years in industry I have led and managed a number of strategic, operational and change management projects and have a wealth of knowledge in these areas which can be utilised in school. This aside, nothing gives me more motivation than visiting school during the day and seeing the smiles on the faces of the children, their exceptional behaviour whilst they learn and them saying 'Hello,' as they enjoy their day in school.

What do you think is the most challenging aspect of being Chair could be and how will you seek to overcome this?

I enjoy being Chair of Governors and visiting school to see the many events that happen in school. Recently being at the Christmas performance was amazing and seeing the confidence of the young children and the joy on their faces when they saw their adults in the audience supporting them.
